Archbishop Edmund J. Fitzmaurice Memorial Lecture - June 12th

The St. Thomas More Society and the Notre Dame Club of Delaware are pleased to welcome Walter J. Nicgorski, Ph.D., Professor Emeritus – Program of Liberal Studies and Concurrent Professor – Political Science at the University of Notre Dame. Dr. Nicgorski will present a lecture entitled "The Federalist Papers: A Unique and American Great Book." The lecture will be held at **Theatre N, The Nemours Building, 1000 North Orange Street, Wilmington,** Delaware 19801.

Dr. Nicgorski's lecture will explore the origin and nature of *The Federalist Papers*, the influential collection that addresses the philosophy of the Constitution. The lecture will sample the book's rich insights into political life and human nature. It will trace the book's role in good times and bad times – from the creation of judicial review in *Marbury v. Madison* to President Nixon's resignation to the impeachment of President Clinton.

Walter Nicgorski joined the University of Notre Dame faculty in 1964, coming from the University of Chicago where he completed his M.A. and Ph.D. He served 20 years at The Review of Politics, where he was chief editor from 1994-2004.

Earlier, he chaired the Program of Liberal Studies, Notre Dame's 62-year-old Great Books Program. He has been a visiting scholar at Harvard University and at Cambridge University, as well as a visiting tutor in the Graduate Institute of St. John's College (Santa Fe, N.M.).

A light reception will be held from 5:30 p.m. – 6:00 p.m. The lecture, followed by questions and answers, will be from 6:00 p.m. – 7:30 p.m. **The lecture is free and all are welcome.
